of us to be better off



### WHAT SHOULD WE DO TO MAKE POLICE ACCOUNTABLE?

#### **Buy body cameras?**

- Increase police funding to buy these cameras
- Increase the scale of policing as they can turn them off

### Implement community policing?

- Increase police funding to hire new cops
- Decrease safety as police is not focused on keeping people safe
- Increase scale of policing to hire more cops, especially in black and brown communities

### Do more trainings?

- Increase police funding to develop and run trainings
- Decrease safety as police violence and harm is not a cause of lack of training
- Increase scale of policing as police will go to any kind of problem, ex. mental health

#### **Create more rules?**

 Police handle the law after the fact to justify the way they decided to restore the order

### WHEN WE TALK ABOLITION

Abolition: the action or an act of abolishing a system, practice, or institution.

Abolitionism historically refers to the movement to end the transatlantic slave trade and to set all enslaved people free.

The word abolition has taken on new meaning since the eras of emancipation of the late 19th century, Jim Crow & segregation of the early to mid 20th century, and Mass Incarceration from the late 20th century on to today.

Abolition today is "a political vision with the goal of eliminating imprisonment, policing, and surveillance and creating lasting alternatives to punishment and imprisonment".

This definition comes from Critical Resistance, one of the nations leading prison abolitionist organizations founded in 1997 to build a mass movement to dismantle policing and the prison industrial complex!

### WHEN WE TALK ABOLITION

we mean no longer giving power, resources, or <u>legitmacy</u> to institutions of policing and incarceration

Abolition will be a necessarily distributive practice. Defunding the police means investing in life affirming resources and relationships.

New York City spends more on policing than it does on the Departments of Health, Homeless Services, Housing Preservation and Development, and Youth and Community Development combined.

in the 2020-2021 Los Angeles city budget, \$3.14 billion out of \$10.5 billion will go to the LAPD.



### THIS IS ABOUT REVOLUTION

The police rarely focuses on workplace abuses by bosses or "white collar" crime by the wealthy. Instead they protect commercial areas, and to a lesser extent, the property of the middle classes. Crucially, the most widespread form of oppression in capitalist society is not policed at all: our exploitation on the job, where the value we create for employers is stolen as profits. Exploitation of this kind is considered entirely normal and lawful, a crime hidden in plain sight.

# OVER 95% OF ALL CRIMINAL CASES RESOLUTIONS

A plea bargain is a pre-trial arrangement between the prosecution and a defendant where the defendant pleads guilty to a lesser charge or an agreement for less punishment for the same charges. It is an agreement between the parties.

### # PROBLEMS

- Governments don't want to spend the money to take every criminal defendant to trial. They rely on the fact that a large proportion of defendants will opt for a plea deal.
- The criminal system assumes from beginning to end that people who agree to plead guilty are actually guilty.
- People agree for plea bargains under pressure.
- It seems to be unconstitutional, as it takes away the defense's constitutional right to a trial by jury.
- Judges are predominately white and male.

### **# IMPACT**

- Even if you are innocent, but agreed to a guilty plea, you still have to pay a fine or be imprisoned for a crime you did not commit. You will also have a criminal record that cannot be erased.
- As a result of being imprisoned people lose their jobs, get sick, being traumatised, separated from their families.

### BLACK PANTHERS, COOPERATIVES AND REVOLUTIONARY EXPANSION

COOPERATIVES CAN BE USEFUL FOR A REVOLUTIONARY MOVEMENT, WHEN THEY SERVE AS AN ECONOMIC BASE FOR THE MOVEMENT, A GOOD EXAMPLE OF THIS TYPE OF APPLICATION IS THE WAY THE BLACK PANTHERS USED COOPERATIVES TO BOLSTER THEIR MOVEMENT.

FROM HUEY P. NEWTON "ON THE RELEVANCE OF THE CHURCH (1971)":

"THE BLACK PANTHER PARTY, WITH ITS SURVIVAL PROGRAMS, PLANS TO DEVELOP THE INSTITUTIONS IN THE COMMUNITY. WE HAVE A CLOTHING FACTORY WE ARE JUST ERECTING ON THIRD STREET, WHERE WE WILL SOON GIVE AWAY ABOUT THREE HUNDRED TO FOUR HUNDRED NEW ARTICLES OF CLOTHING EACH MONTH. AND WE CAN DO THIS BY ROBBING PETER TO PAY PAUL. WHAT WE WILL DO IS START TO MAKE GOLFING BAGS UNDER CONTRACT TO A COMPANY, AND WITH THE SURPLUS WE WILL BUY MATERIAL TO MAKE FREE CLOTHES. OUR MEMBERS WILL DO THIS. WE WILL HAVE NO OVERHEAD BECAUSE OF OUR COLLECTIVE (WE'LL "EXPLOIT" OUR COLLECTIVE BY MAKING THEM WORK FREE). WE WILL DO THIS NOT JUST TO SATISFY OURSELVES, LIKE THE PHILANTHROPIST, OR TO SERVE, OR TO SAVE SOMEONE FROM GOING WITHOUT SHOES, EVEN THOUGH THIS IS PART OF THE CAUSE OF OUR PROBLEM, BUT TO HELP THE PEOPLE MAKE THE REVOLUTION. WE WILL GIVE THE PROCESS A FORWARD THRUST."

# A POLITICIAN IS ONLY AS STRONG AS THEIR POLICY!

A form of voter suppression is the miseducation around the impact of voting, and the power of knowing the policies that are being put forward.



We must educate ourselves on who is running locally, and how their policies directly affect our lives, and the consequences they'll have on future generations.



When voting, you need to ask yourself: what is the plan for your community and how does it aligns with your lived experiences/values.



Systemic change happens when black folks unify to create a cooperative sustainable list of demands from our elected/appointed officials.



Local, state, and national policy reform is the start for radical change.

Reflect on your lived experiences to acknowledge how it impacts your perspectives/values



Normalize political talk by having open and honest conversations w/loved ones



Interact with diverse resources: media, books, academic sources



Learn about elected/appointed officials in your district-- start w/local and expand to federal



Attend town hall meetings (in-person and virtually)

### Make your voice heard

As a constituent you have power to determine who gets into office and whether those officials get to stay there.

- 1. Talk with your leaders:
  - a. Contact your local representatives to express your concerns about your community
  - b. Express dissent with legislative officials voting decisions
    - 2. Join engagement initiatives:
      - a. Confirm that the organization is amplifying marginalized voices and aligns with your values/ethics
      - b. Attend protest, rallies and marches

### **Vote Vote Vote**

- Learn your states voting plans
- Think about voting not only as an expression of your beliefs but also as a choice with consequences


